On August 16, 2004, JF entered fifth year towards the achievement of its goal of sustainable development. We do this by sharing and developing skills, facilitating organizational effectiveness and supporting organizational growth. The implementation efforts among tribals, marginalized and underprivileged, with emphasis on women and children commenced when the core team decided to have the geographic thrust of JF interventions at the Kalimati region in embedded with a Jharkhand. Presently growing track record in program arenas pertaining to education, micro finance and micro enterprise development, health (with specific focus on RCH & HIV /AIDS), Training and development; JF has demonstrated illustrations of success stories at its intervention areas to support replication.

With enriching experience and growing profile, JF is currently strategizing to have its development program initiated in the National Capital Region of Delhi.

To celebrate four years of operation, the core team launched quarterly "e-Bulletin" and "e groups" to strengthen institution's mandate on information dissemination as a knowledge resource on development arena.

Through JF's effort and

conceptualization of the sharing of wealth to affect social justice for the weakest sections, whole communities are emerging as selfsustaining, showing

themselves to be capable of planning and implementing their own future through self governance and even self financing. They have realized that poverty is not just economic; it is intellectual, cultural, social and related to justice. Today, they have risen; the SHGs are more prominent, proving themselves functionally successful in income generation, livelihood systems, education and agriculture. JF SHGs are conceived as major contributor to all aspects of living beyond finance.

With growing implementation experience in Self Help Groups (SHGs) and its related capacity building initiatives, JF has prepared itself to provide guidance for all business development needs of the groups. This stands in relation to a number of micro enterprises being taken up by the groups, which are primarily in arena of handicrafts, land resource and consumer durables, particularly food processing.

With its skills set in the development of appropriate participatory training materials (games, role plays, exercises) for illiterate tribal women, JF further strategizes to contribute as a retail marketing support for NGO partners, primarily in crafts and food processing sector. Linkages are continuously being made with select upscale stores and institutions for promotion of products. UCO Bank, State Bank of India recognized the initiative of Self Help Groups in Saraikela Kharsawan by providing the groups with revolving funds.



JF further is gearing ahead to have the standards set for good practice micro enterprises for women.

Key Facts

- Women in the villages at Gamaharia Block, District Saraikela Kharsawan, Jharkhand set up self-help groups (SHGs) to save themselves from money lenders.
- Needy People get loans on minimal interest: Just Rs. 01 for every Rs. 100 the SHG lends.

Education Initiatives

JF becomes the driving force in taking ahead the mandate of Adult Literacy Program at Block Adityapur in District Saraikela Kharsawan, Jharkhand.

The Adult Literacy Program implemented at Adityapur Block in support from TCS, aims to create initial resource hub (knowledge base) of current out-of-school initiatives focused on socially embedded programs for skills training among adult populations. The effort is more on providing opportunities for informal learning in culturally-sensitive, real-world context, unlike the school environment.



The ICT-based models are used for socially embedded learning. This provides an ambience to processes that enables all beneficiaries to acquire relevant expected literacy competencies in a manner relevant to their day-to-day life applications. In sum, the adult learning facilitates at creating potential and skills for new opportunities related to livelihood and empowerment issues.

Looking beyond the exercise, JF strategizes to lay the foundation for subsequent development of ICT-based solutions with successful demonstrations of community mobilization that would further enhance innovation at participatory learning techniques and related implementation.

In sum, the essence of all JF education efforts revolves around the vision of promoting rights of vulnerable girls and women to quality education.

Health Initiatives

JF contributes in Catch up Program (Second Round) at Block: ADITYAPUR in District: SARAIKELA KHARSAWAN, Jharkhand.



In close collaboration with the Govt. of Jharkhand's Department of Health and Family Welfare and the Women and Child Development Department, JF successfully implemented the RCH Catch Up Program that focuses on increased immunization coverage, mobilization efforts (through home visits, groups meetings, focused group discussions (FGD), awareness about supplementary nutrition related service and deliverv indicators).

The focus group for program intervention is the pregnant mothers and the children upto the age of 06 years. The attempt is to identify grade IV (very weak) children for consistent follow-up, referrals and related care. In all 1933 Pregnant Mothers, 1769 Lactating Mothers, 1816 Neonates, and 8290 children were diagnosed through the health camps in Adityapur Block of the tribal district Saraikela Kharsawan in the state of Jharkhand.

JF seeks to facilitate a people-centered and people-driven development process that addresses socio-economic, cultural and ecological problems of this region through an integrated approach. Drawing from this, community health initiative seeks to look beyond conventional approaches to health care that revolves around promoting good health and adequate nutrition, especially for women and children.

Training and Development

Learning through participatory techniques and games is an integral component of training and development within JF. With a vision to deliver to larger segment and specifically allow "Change makers" to become self sustainable; vibrant learning atmosphere is provided during training sessions through innovative adult learning techniques.




The exercise aims at building the capacity of individual educators to develop systems that impacts development interventions related to Self Help Groups, leadership, Micro Planning, conflict management etc.

JF facilitates SHGs to market their products through Gram Shree Mela

The Indian handicrafts have a good history. But as we witness today, the present generation's interest in rural handicrafts is on a declining trend.

In order to promote rural handicrafts, JF participated in Gram Shree Mela and arranged stalls for SHGs to display potteries, handicraft items, spices and jams prepared by them. Handicrafts were positioned and marketed more as utilities. The hard work involved in minute craft work was observable by appreciation and response from people.

Through this effort, an opportunity was provided to the artisan groups to come to mainstream and display their products. The initiative aided them to have a first hand customer feedback that is the biggest component of skill and product development. Participation in platforms and forums like this gives a boost to rural industry and at the same time provides the tribal beneficiaries a potential for a sustained livelihood.


