The sensitization workshop started with the commencing speech of Mrs Shipra Ganguly. He was of the view that more than 16000 known species are threatened with extinction, but the number could be more.

Mr. A.K.Tiwari of The JF highlighted that with growing economy we are losing the intellectual patents of nature before we even have the chance to understand or unravel the nature. "This is the tragedy of not understanding biodiversity," he said, adding it would be a "big fallacy" to think that biodiversity is not linked to the phenomenon of climate change.

The Bhatia Basti community groups present were also apprised on issues related to biodiversity preservation. As part of her speech, Ms. Seema said, "We are creating an illusion that everything is fine, and we are getting richer and richer. But we are doing it at



the expense of our children and grandchildren...all in the name of economic growth and progress,"

The smaller groups of audiences were made aware of the real bottom line that clean air, clean water, clean soil gives us our nutritious and good food, clean energy that comes from the sun, and biodiversity provides us with rich source of vitamins and prevents us from many diseases. Therefore, these are ultimately the most important needs that we have to fight for at all cost.



In continuation to the same, a quiz contest was held in the smaller group on issues pertaining to environment, cleanliness and Biodiversity conservation. Related prizes were given to the winner of the quiz competition.
